Essential Functions for the Dental Hygienist

General Information

Weber State University Department of Dental Hygiene applicants must be aware of functional requirements, environmental factors, and psychosocial demands that must be met to be fully aware of the demands of the dental hygienist in the clinical setting. Functional requirements include, but are not limited to: the ADA Essential Job Functions as they pertain to a dental hygienist and necessary physical abilities. Further, environmental factors and mental function skills contribute to the functional requirements that need to be met in this profession. It is imperative that the student who is pursuing a career in dental hygiene be informed of the **essential job functions of a dental hygienist (required):**

Vision –associated functions and skills: near acuity (vision at 20 in or less); far acuity (vision at 20 ft or more); depth perception (three dimensional vision); accommodation (adjustment of vision to clear focus, close work); color vision (ability to identify & distinguish colors); field of vision (area that can be seen from right/left, up/down while fixed on one point).

Have the ability to read, understand, and apply printed material, which may include instructions printed on medical/dental devices, equipment and supplies.

Visually distinguish subtle diagnostic variations in physical appearance of persons served. An example would be "pale color."

Hearing – associated functions and skills: Ability to identify and distinguish subtle variations in body sounds such as breathing, heart sounds during blood pressure measurement.

Ability to perceive the nature of sounds.

Ability to communicate to impart information: speaking and hearing

Speaking – associated functions and skills:

Effectively communicate in English, in both written & verbal format

Ability to communicate to impart information: speaking and hearing

Olfactory sense/smell – associated functions and skills:

Ability to distinguish subtle olfactory changes in physical characteristics of persons served.

Mental - associated functions and skills:

include judgment, comparing, computing, compiling, analyzing, coordinating, synthesizing, negotiating, communicating, positive interpersonal skills and behavior that is recognized as that of a health care professional Ability to maintain emotional stability during periods of high stress.

Ability to work in an emotionally charged or stressful environment.

Physical essential functions and skills (and sense of touch):

Ability to lift - Lifting requirements (equivalent to lifting); (sometimes necessary) lifting of weight up to 25 lbs. * Ability to independently and assist other health care professionals in their efforts to push, pull and lift a medically fragile adult in a medical or dental setting.

Ability to perform physical demands: including standing, walking, sitting (for extended periods of time), climbing, reaching, finger dexterity, feeling (touch, hearing; perceiving the nature of sounds)

Ability to palpate oral structures, head and neck, arms for blood pressure and pulse and other structures and be able to differentiate and report subtle variations in temperature, consistency, texture and structure.

Possess the ability to simultaneously and rapidly coordinate mental and muscular coordination when performing tasks.

Environmental Factors and associated functions and skills:

Ability to work in confined and/or crowded spaces.

Ability to work independently as well as with coordinated teams

Have the knowledge, skills and ability to work safely with a potential exposure to harmful substances and/or hazards at the workplace

Have the knowledge and skills to be able to work safely while being engaged in the treatment of individuals with potential blood borne diseases
