___ Have you applied to Weber State University (may be done online at weber.edu)

___ Is your college/university overall cumulative GPA at least **3.0**?

___ To be eligible to apply, you must be able to check **all** support courses from the one of the two Track options listed below, showing you have completed the courses with a grade of '**C**' or **higher**. *All courses within the required support course must be completed or in progress prior to starting the Athletic Therapy program:*

Track I

- ___ Int. Anat/Phy I (HTHS 1110)
- ___ Int. Anat/Phy II (HTHS 1111)
- ___ Psychology 1010
- ___ Nutrition 1020

OR

Track II

- ___ Human Anatomy (Zool 2100)
- ___ Human Physiology (Zool 2200)
- ___ Psychology 1010
- ___ Nutrition 1020

___ To be eligible to apply, you must complete the following Athletic Therapy courses with a grade of 'B-' or higher. *These AT courses must be completed prior to acceptance into the AT program.*

- ___ AT 1550 Introduction to Athletic Therapy (1)
- ___ AT 3300 Evaluation and Care of Musculoskeletal Injuries: Lower Extremities (3)

___ Math Quantitative Literacy Level Recommendation:

- ___ We highly recommend that you meet the Math 1050 QL requirement. Math 1050 QL is a prerequisite for upper division support courses within the program.
- ___ ACT Math Score of 23 or higher.
- ___ Accuplacer College Level Math (CLM) core of 50 or higher within the last year
(Be aware that certain graduate programs may require a Math grade or other courses past Math 1050 QL.)

PROGRAM INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

What do I do after I have been admitted into the program?

Once you complete the application and the required courses, contact the Program Director Dr. Conrad Gabler (conradgabler@weber.edu) to set up a meeting.

Application Approval required for upper division AT classes.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling admissions basis. Students who fail to meet admission requirements will not be allowed to enroll in AT 4150, AT 4250, AT4650 or AT 4800.

Required Criteria

After students are selected into the program, their retention is based on these criteria:

- Grade of B- or better in all athletic therapy major courses
- Grade of C or better in all support courses and electives
- Overall Weber State University GPA of 3.0 or higher in all courses required for this major
- Adherence to the [Department of Athletic Training and Nutrition Student Conduct Policy \(PDF\)](#).

Students who fail to meet our retention criteria will be placed on probation in the athletic therapy major for one semester.

Probationary Period rules for failure to meet required criteria.

During probationary periods, the following actions are taken:

- Students who receive any grade below a B- in an athletic therapy major course must repeat that course, and receive a grade of B- or higher to remain in the major.
- Students who receive any grade below a C in an athletic therapy support course or elective must repeat that course, and receive a grade of C or higher to remain in the major.
- Failure to repeat a course (when offered) will result in dismissal from the program at the discretion of the program director.
