___ Is your college/university overall cumulative GPA at least 2.0?

___ **To be eligible to apply**, you need to have a final or progress grade from one of the two Science Options listed below (at least one final grade is preferred).

___ ZOOL 2320 Human Anatomy (*formerly 2100*)

*If completing either Science Option course during the Spring semester, when applications are due, have your instructor submit a progress grade for the course – **Due: March 1!***

___ Prior to starting the Radiologic Technology program, complete *all* of the following Support courses:

___ English 1010 or 1005 or 1006 & 1007

___ English 2010 or 2015

___ Psychology 1010

___ Communication 1020 or 2110

___ Math 1010* **or** Math QL

~Students with a completed AS/BS Degree have fulfilled the support course requirements.

**Math 1010 is required for the AAS degree for Radiologic Technology; however, if pursuing a Bachelors Degree in an Advanced Radiologic Sciences programs, students will be required to fulfill Math QL Weber.edu/wsuiimages/placement/math-path-2023.pdf Math 1010 will expire after two years as a prerequisite.*

___ Complete the AAS Radiologic Technology Online application by **January 10**.

Once I am qualified, how do I improve my chances of getting accepted?

- Grades are the biggest part of the selection process, especially Science Option courses. Average GPA of accepted students is a 3.5, with grades of 'A, A-' in the Science Option courses. Grades in Science Option courses are **weighted heavily!**
- For the interview process, it is ideal to get into a Radiology department within a hospital or clinic and obtain observation, job shadow, or volunteer experience. Additional resources are found at arrt.org or asrt.org. If unable to get into a Radiology department, any direct-patient experience may help.
- Although first-time applicants may be accepted into the program, additional consideration will be given to previously qualified applicants.
- Additional consideration for an earned AS/AA or higher degree, and any 3 medical certifications (*pg. 2 LPT, EKG*).
- Ensure most recent semester grades and degree if applicable, are posted on your transcript before uploading a copy of your unofficial transcript(s) to the application (including WSU). This may necessitate the need to complete the application in early-January as opposed to December.
- Students may apply to multiple Radiologic Technology locations. However, many Outreach locations give preference to students living in the area or surrounding areas.
- The online application includes a fee (per location), recommendations, essay, and transcripts.

How do my credits transfer from other institutions?

The best thing to do is to become a Weber State student and submit your transcripts for evaluation. Then you'll know exactly what they equal. There is the [Weber.edu/transferguide](https://weber.edu/transferguide) to search for courses from other regionally-accredited colleges/universities to see how those courses *may* transfer to Weber State University.

Is there a time limit to how old my courses can be?

There is no expiration for any of the prerequisite courses; however, if intending to pursue a Bachelor's degree in Advanced Radiologic Sciences, it is highly recommended students fulfill Math Quantitative Literacy (QL).

What should I expect once I'm accepted into the program?

The Radiologic Technology program is a five-straight semester program (Fall, Spring, Summer, Fall, Spring). You will have class once a week, lab a few times each semester, and 24 hours a week of clinical work at your assigned facility (traditionally three days of 8-hour shifts). Clinical sites are assigned to you by the department.
