Once I am qualified to apply, how do I improve my chances of getting accepted?

___ Submit a completed application by the deadline. The online application is available at

- Complete as many Science Option and Support courses prior to applying, with a grade of 'C' or higher.
- Complete an AS/AA or BS/BA degree from any regionally-accredited institution. AS in HTHS is a little more.

- Although first-time applicants may be accepted into the program, additional consideration will be given to previously qualified applicants.
- Complete a mock interview with Career Services 801-626-6393 to prepare for the group interviews. After completing prerequisites and gen eds, students can take **HIM 3300** Intro to Quality Improvement in Healthcare (3), and **6** additional upper division elective hours (3,000+ level) that would go towards the program.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do my credits transfer from other institutions?

The best thing to do is to become a Weber State student and submit your transcripts for evaluation. Then you'll know exactly what they equal. There is the *weber.edu/transferguide* to search for courses from other regionally-accredited colleges/universities to see how those courses *may* transfer to Weber State University.

Is there a time limit to how old my courses can be?

There is no expiration for any of the prerequisite courses; however, if students stop at Math 0950, 0990, 0970 or 1010, and do not fulfill Math Quantitative Literacy (QL), Math will expire after two years per WSU policy. Once a student completes the Math QL requirement, there is no expiration.

What should I take? First priority should be the applicant checklist; second priority should be the general education requirements and completing an AS Degree; third could be taking HIM 3300 Intro to Quality Improvement in Healthcare (3) and 6 additional upper division elective hours (3,000+ level) that would go towards the program. Anyone is allowed to take REST 3502 Intro to Sleep Disorders (2).

Do I need letters of recommendation?

No. The department does not ask for letters of recommendation. The online application consists of a fee, unofficial transcripts from all colleges and universities (including WSU). If students complete the CNA or EMT course or certification in place of REST 1560, proof of this needs to be uploaded.

What should I expect once I'm accepted into the program?

You will have lab and class three times a week and clinical hours twice a week at your assigned facilities. Clinical sites are assigned to you by the department and range from Logan to Draper. The length of the program varies by location, Ogden is 4 semesters (no Summer), WSU-Davis (in Layton) and Farmington SLC are 5 consecutive semesters. The WSU Farmington location is above Old Navy at Farmington Station.

Are there night courses available?

The prerequisite courses may be done at night or online; however, the Respiratory Therapy program is taught during the day (not online). You will need to be available from 8:00-5:00 Monday through Friday for the program.
