Free UTA Ed Pass

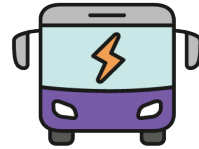

Ogden Express (OGX)



Use the Ogden Express (OGX) bus rapid transit system to shuttle from the Dee Event Center to two stops on campus via an electric bus. It will also create a direct route from the Ogden Frontrunner station to WSU.

Active Transportation



Bike lanes are located at the new Davis campus entrance and on the exterior roads that loop around the Ogden campus. WSU also provides bike racks, bike fix-it stations, and a set of bike lockers.

EV Charging Stations



There are multiple electric vehicle (EV) charging stations available at Ogden, Davis, and Monroe campuses for you to conveniently charge your EV at a low cost.
