

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLYING FOR THE TERREL H. BELL SCHOLARSHIP AT
WEBER STATE UNIVERSITY FOR CONTINUING STUDENTS**

The purpose of the Terrel H. Bell Teaching Education Scholarship is to recruit students into teaching careers and encourage students to teach in high needs areas in Utah public schools, while recognizing teaching as a critically important career choice in the state of Utah.

All blanks must be completed. If the answer is none or does not apply, so indicate. Please include the following items as attachments to your application:

1. **Names** and phone numbers of references from three faculty members who are familiar with the student's work. (If you are a transfer student, these references can be from faculty at your previous college or university.)
2. A one-page statement indicating why you should be considered for the scholarship, focusing on leadership, service activities, and particular financial need. Priority will be given first to first-generation students who intend to enter the teaching profession, second to those who intend to work in high-need fields, and third to all other applicants.

All paperwork must be submitted to the Teacher Education Advisement Center, ED Room 230, by February 1. Students should be admitted to the Teacher Education Program to be eligible. (If you are applying for the Teacher Education Program Spring semester, and have met all requirements for admission, you are eligible to apply.) If you are chosen as a recipient, the scholarship will be awarded beginning Fall semester.

If any of the above information is lacking, your application **will not** be considered. Please note- if you already have a bachelor's degree, you are still eligible for this scholarship.

If you are awarded the Terrel H. Bell Scholarship, you must register for and complete at least twelve (12) hours each semester (full-time student).
